



2018-2019 Rule Book

Article I

Title, Objects, Location

Section 1. Title: NMCCA shall be shown as the New Mexico Club Calf Association (NMCCA). NMCCA will be operated and conducted as an organization in accordance with the laws of the State of New Mexico providing for such organizations.

Section 2. Objects: The purpose of NMCCA shall be to collect, record, and preserve the records of the club calf competition from one year to the next, to publish a summary of the results, to stimulate competition among 4-H and FFA exhibitors, and to award awards, if donors are available, to the top individual exhibitors of club calves and heifers throughout the course of one fiscal year based on the total number of points accumulated within a given breed division.

Section 3. Location: The principle location of the NMCCA shall be Alamogordo, Otero County, but its members or officers may be residents of any county in the state of New Mexico, and business may be carried out at any place convenient to such members or officials, as may be participating.

Article II

Members

Section 1. Members of the NMCCA shall be admitted, retained and expelled in accordance with such rules and regulations as the Board of Directors may, from time to time, adopt.

Section 2. Special meetings of the members may be held at such time and place and may be designated in notice, whenever called IN WRITING BY DIRECTION OF THE PRESIDENT.

Section 3. Membership shall be limited to the bonafide 4-H and FFA members in the state of New Mexico.

Section 4: Members must fill out and submit a membership card for the NMCCA office use.

Section 5. A fee of \$2.00 per head per ring on steers and heifers shall be collected at each show through an entry fee and will constitute membership in the association. The office fee must be mailed to Directors of said Association within five (5) days following shows.

Section 6. To receive points to apply to the yearly standings in either steer division competition, heifer division competition; members must be an active member of the NMCCA at the show from which you receive points.

Section 7. Any member may be suspended and denied privileges of the NMCCA and only non-member may be denied privileges of the association for failure to pay, when due, any obligation owing to the shows Association, any of its sanctioned shows, or for giving a worthless check for entry fees, office charges, stock charges, or any other fees or charges connected with the NMCCA and its sanctioned shows. However, fifteen (15) days before action by the Director, written notice of the account due shall be delivered to such member or non-member. The suspension and denial of privileges under this section shall terminate upon full payment of the obligation due to NMCCA.

Section 8. A member or non-member shall not conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate the rules of the NMCCA, or to knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons, either by affirmative action or inaction, to violate this rule shall subject such member or non-member to disciplinary action, whether or not such member or non-member has actually signed reports filed with NMCCA asserted to be true and correct.

RULES and REGULATIONS of EXHIBITION

1. These rules and regulations shall become and be effective January 1st, 2018 and thereupon all Rules and Regulations and parts thereof heretofore enforced are hereby repealed, except that the status all registrations and records made upon previous rules shall remain unchanged.
2. The rules as printed in the NMCCA OFFICIAL RULEBOOK shall be used at all approved shows and contests unless otherwise approved by the President and Director of the NMCCA.

Show Approval

3. Organizations or individuals wishing to stage or sponsor a NMCCA show, and wishing to be sanctioned by the Association must obtain the prior approval of the NMCCA, if the results of such show is to be entered in the NMCCA's records and points are to be awarded to the exhibitors who place sufficiently high in their classes. Approval does not carry over from year to year, but must be obtained for each individual show or contest. Organizations or individuals wishing to have a sanctioned show must sign and return a standard Show Contract, secured from the NMCCA Executive Director. If the individual show has rules, those rules must be submitted to the NMCCA director at least thirty (30) days prior to the show or contest.
4. To gain NMCCA approval, a show must be open to all club calves exhibitors who are in good standing with NMCCA and are members of a 4-H or FFA organization within the state. All animals that receive points must receive payback at said jackpot.
6. The results of any approved show or contest must be completed in their entirety on official forms and forwarded to the NMCCA Executive Director. The forms must contain the names of the first eight exhibitors in order of their placing and a notation made about the number of animals exhibited in the class.
7. If the show management does not report the show results to the NMCCA director within ten (10) days after said show, approval of any subsequent show may be denied.
8. Arizona and Colorado youth may show in NMCCA shows but will not receive points in NMCCA towards awards.

INCOMPLETE Results

- A. Incomplete or inaccurate reports from any shows can cause deserving exhibitors to lose a part or all of the points they should have earned at that show.
 - B. The NMCCA is not responsible for incorrect results from show officials.
9. The NMCCA reserves the right to set up a NMCCA's booth at all sanctioned prospect shows at no additional charge to the NMCCA. This booth shall be used to sell NMCCA merchandise, enroll members, and distribute literature and publications.
 10. All Show must be weekend shows.
 11. All shows will be on a CASH ONLY basis.
 12. The NMCCA requires that approved shows use the breed category format and it is recommended to break steer classes by weight if possible.
 13. The NMCCA will not be responsible for the formulation or enforcement of individual show rules. These are the sole responsibility of the show management.

SHOW Points

14. The NMCCA will award awards to NMCCA steer division members accumulating the greatest number of points in the following breed divisions within a given year : Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn, Charolais, Chianina, Limousin, Maine-Anjou, Simmental and Cross. For classification breeds, the NMCCA will use the format used by the NM State Fair.
- 14 a. There will be a 3 head minimum for each breed of steers. If at any show, there are less than three head, they will be placed into an AOB division and the points will transfer to the declared breed for each steer. AOB will only be for steers declared in a breed that does not meet the minimum requirement to show. There will be no minimum for the AOB division. There will be no minimum per breed for heifers.
15. The NMCCA will award the Overall Heifer exhibitor award to the heifer exhibitor earning the most points throughout the year.
- 15a. The NMCCA will award four breed division awards to NMCCA heifer division members accumulating the greatest number of points in the following breed divisions in a given year: British – (Angus, Shorthorn, Red Angus, Hereford, Aberdeen Angus), Continental – (Simmental, Maine, Limousin, Charolais, Chianina, Gelbvieh, Saler), American – (Brangus, Brahman, Santa Gertrudis) and Commerical – (Non-Registered Heifers). These heifers must be shown in their respective breeds at the NM State Fair to receive points for the entire year.
16. The NMCCA awards an All-Around Exhibitor Award to the member who accumulates the largest number of points.
17. Points will be awarded at all NMCCA sanctioned shows during the year prior to the NM State Fair. The NM State Fair will be final point show of the year.
18. If one steer division member or heifer division member owns two (2) or more animals and more than one (1) animal is shown in the same class, the member receives points for all animals that said member owns in the class.
19. When steer shows and heifers shows are held and approved, the NMCCA and individual breed division classes are not used as the format, the points are recorded for placing individuals based on how the member entered the official entry card for the show, or the member can specify the breed of said steer or heifer on the official NMCCA form. This form must be signed and returned within ten (10) days of the show. Classification is done by the exhibitor.
20. Members may receive only the exact number of points as listed in the point table in the NMCCA Rulebook.
21. Once points are recorded to an individual member within any one of the breed divisions for steer competition, the breed divisions for heifer competition, points are non-transferable to any breed division. Incorrect breed information is the fault of the exhibitor and the NMCCA will not assume responsibility. Therefore, recorded results will not be changed.

22. All 4-H and FFA members must show their own animals in the ring. If a member has two (2) animals in the same class, then another member may show one for them.
23. In the steer and heifer divisions, individual members may only be awarded points by exhibiting animals that are owned by said exhibitor. "Loan out," animals may not be used to accumulate points. Bill of sale and brand inspection may be requested by show officials.
24. In all divisions, steers or heifers must be entered in the name of the individual member to whom the points will be awarded and accumulated in his/her name.
25. NMCCA sanctioned jackpots must name a Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, 3rd, 4th and 5th overall for Steers and Heifers in each ring.
26. The NMCCA point system will have added points for grand and reserve grand, breed champion and reserve breed champion which will be calculated as follows; Grand will receive ten (10) additional point for each steer or heifer in the show. Reserve grand will receive five (5) point for each steer or heifer in the show. Breed champions will receive two (2) additional point for each steer or heifer in the breed division. Reserve breed champion will receive one (1) point for each steer or heifer in that breed division. Additionally, steers and heifers placing 3rd-5th overall shall receive the following points. 3rd Overall Steer: 4 points, 4th Overall Steer: 3 points and 5th overall: 2 points.
27. If an animal is classified different at the State Fair than he has been shown all year, then a committee made up of 5 advisory board members from the NMCCA can allow the exhibitor to receive points in the class at the New Mexico State Fair but credit these points to the breed division in which the animal has been shown throughout the jackpot season. If the committee concurs with the classification at the NM State Fair, then no points will be given for the complete show season for said animal. If an exhibitor in the NMCCA leads their animal into a class, at the NM State Fair, other than the one in which the animal has been exhibited all season, the exhibitor will lose all points accumulated in the original class for the complete season for said animal. They will receive points at the NM State Fair for the new class entered.
28. Classifications will be done by the exhibitor. Each animal will be classified at the first jackpot they attend and will remain the same throughout the jackpot season.
29. Exhibitors attending out of state jackpots shall not receive points toward the NMCCA.
30. Maximum entry fees for the NMCCA sanctioned shows shall be \$35 entry fee.
31. Fitting and grooming of steers and heifers will follow NM State Fair rules and no twine or artificial material may be used-except for material that comes out of a spray can.

New Mexico Club Calf Association

Advisory Board

Purposes

1. To serve as an advisory group to the NMCCA.
2. To work cooperatively for providing the members of the NMCCA with the best possible avenues for exhibiting their animals.

Membership

1. The membership of the NMCCA Advisory boards shall consist of maximum five (4) independent individuals, plus the Director of the NM Club Calf Association.

Quorum

1. Five (5) members in attendance shall constitute a quorum.

Meetings

1. Meetings may be called by the President, or Director of the NMCCA whenever it comes to the attention of the parties that there is legitimate business to discuss.

Origination of Proposals

1. The Advisory Board may receive suggestions or requests for the development of new policies, revision of existing policies or elimination of any.
2. The advisory Board may itself originate proposals.
3. The President or Director of the NMCCA may originate proposals.
4. The general meeting of show managers may originate proposals.

Junior Officers

New Mexico Club Calf Association

1. PURPOSE: The Junior officers of the NMCCA shall serve as an advisory group to the management of the NMCCA. They shall serve as an open channel of communication between and among show managers, and foster mutual understanding and optimum working conditions between these groups.

2. ELECTED OFFICES: The elected officers shall consist of 1) President; 2) Vice- President; and 3) Secretary/Treasurer.
3. DIRECTORS: The membership of the NMCCA shall elect one (1) director from each of the four regions in the state. These members shall be elected through a general vote of the membership of the NMCCA.
4. The DIRECTOR of the NMCCA shall serve as Ex-Officio member and advisor for the Junior Officers.
5. ORIGINATION OF PROPOSALS: The Junior Officers may receive suggestions or requests for the development of new policies, revision of existing policies or elimination of any. The Junior Officers may themselves originate proposals. Proposals can be originated from the members of the NMCCA.
6. ELECTION OF OFFICERS: At the first meeting of the NMCCA, the members shall elect from among themselves, a President, a Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, and four (4) Directors. The Officers and Directors must be a member of NMCCA from previous show season.

Duties of Each Officer

1. The PRESIDENT shall preside over all meetings of the Junior Officers and at any General Membership meetings.
2. The VICE-PRESIDENT shall preside in the absence of the President and shall assume the duties of the President should the President be unable to complete his/her duties at any time.
3. The SECRETARY shall keep a record of all minutes of meetings.
4. The TREASURER shall assist the Director in financial operations, should the need arise.
5. The four DIRECTORS shall serve as representatives of the members from their respective areas. They shall advise the Junior Officers as to the feelings of the members from their area of the state on proposals and stimulate interest in the NMCCA in each of their areas, as well as helping recruit members from their respective areas.
